

National Road Fund of Liberia Ranks Second Among Best-Performing Public



The National Road Fund of Liberia (NRF) was ranked as the second-best performing public institution in the country under the 2025 Performance Management and Compliance System (PMCS). The ranking, released by the Government of Liberia, places the NRF second public institution recognized for efficiency, transparency, and

adherence to national performance standards. The PMCS is an annual benchmarking system used to evaluate ministries, agencies, and state-owned enterprises based on their compliance, financial accountability, service delivery, and overall institutional management. The NRF, which manages Liberia's road user financing, has consistently earned praise for its dedication to good governance and results-driven operations. According to the 2025 assessment, the NRF scored high marks in both compliance and service delivery, to align with the government's development priorities in infrastructure. Reacting to the news, the Manager of the National Road Fund, Mrs. Joseta Neufville-Wento, described the recognition as a motivating affirmation of her team's. "This award belongs to the hardworking team of the National Road Fund," Mrs. Neufville-Wento said. "Their dedication, professionalism, and shared commitment to excellence made this achievement possible. It motivates us to do even more in supporting President Joseph N. Boakai's priority on roads and infrastructure development across Liberia." This latest recognition follows the Fund's earlier achievement in December 2025, when it topped the Auditor General's Annual Compliance Report with a 93 percent implementation rate of audit recommendations, the highest among 62 government institutions.
